



Tradelink and People's Government of Nansha District, Guangzhou Bureau of Economic and Trade, Jointly Organised Business Delegation to Visit Guangzhou Nansha Bonded Port Area

To help industry players to understand the overall operation, policies and special taxation benefits in the Guangdong Nansha Export Processing Zone (the Zone), Tradelink Electronic Commerce Limited (Tradelink) jointly organised a study tour with People's Government of Nansha District, Guangzhou Bureau of Economic and Trade (the Bureau) on 24 April 2009. 30 Tradelink customers joined the tour.

During the tour, representatives from the Bureau, Nansha Customs House and Nansha Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine introduced the investment environment and policies to the tour members. In addition, through the visiting of the Zone, Guangzhou Nansha Logistics Park and the Nansha Bonded Port, the tour members are able to enhance their understanding towards the Zone. All the tour members highly evaluate the tour as on the one hand, they can experience and understand the operation, policies and special taxation benefits in the Zone. On the other hand, they can take this opportunity to thoroughly explore the business environment and be able to follow the blueprint of China's policies.

Guangzhou Nansha Bond Port Area was officially approved by the State Council last year and will start the operation in the second half of 2009. The Zone adopts "sealed-off" management together with "Free Customs" policy. It is also the most preferential, efficient, well-equipped as well as judiciously managed supervised zone in China so far.

The development of the Zone highly reduces the logistics cost of the enterprises within the Pearl River Delta. Imported and exported goods can enjoy various taxation benefits like exemption of import and export taxes, exemption of the bond of import materials, tax refund for joining the Zone as well as tax refund for water, electricity and gas charges. Imported and exported goods can also be transported freely between the Zone and other countries. Additionally, no quota or permit management is needed except the exported goods subject to quota management. In addition, those commodities that are on the list of duty quota management of processing trade import are not required to apply for import duty quota license.
